This document describes the requirements for admission for students at Capital Normal University to the SUNY Buffalo State – CNU 3+2 program for the Master of Science in Education (MSED) – Childhood & Early Childhood: Curriculum and Instruction The requirements described here are specific to the M.S.Ed. – Childhood & Early Childhood: Curriculum and Instruction program, and are in addition to general requirements for the 3+2 program.

For admission to the Buffalo State MSED - Childhood & Early Childhood: Curriculum and Instruction as part of the Buffalo State – Capital Normal University 3+2 program, students must have completed or demonstrated the following:

- 1. Completion of the following courses:
 - a. Educational Psychology
 - b. Educational Foundations
 - c. Developmental Psychology (Birth age 12)
 - d. Curriculum Design and Assessment
 - e. Classroom Management in Primary Classrooms
 - f. Research Methods in Primary Education
 - g. Educational Technology
 - h. Research Methods
- 2. Concentration in one of the following:
 - a. English
 - b. Science
 - c. Mathematics
 - d. Educational Technology
 - e. Early Childhood

The requirements for admission listed here are for Capital Normal University students in the 3+2 program only. These admissions criteria are meant to provide a framework for the necessary background knowledge all teacher education candidates should have prior to advanced study. However, every effort will be made to select courses at Buffalo State that will compliment and extend the courses already taken at Capital Normal.
